

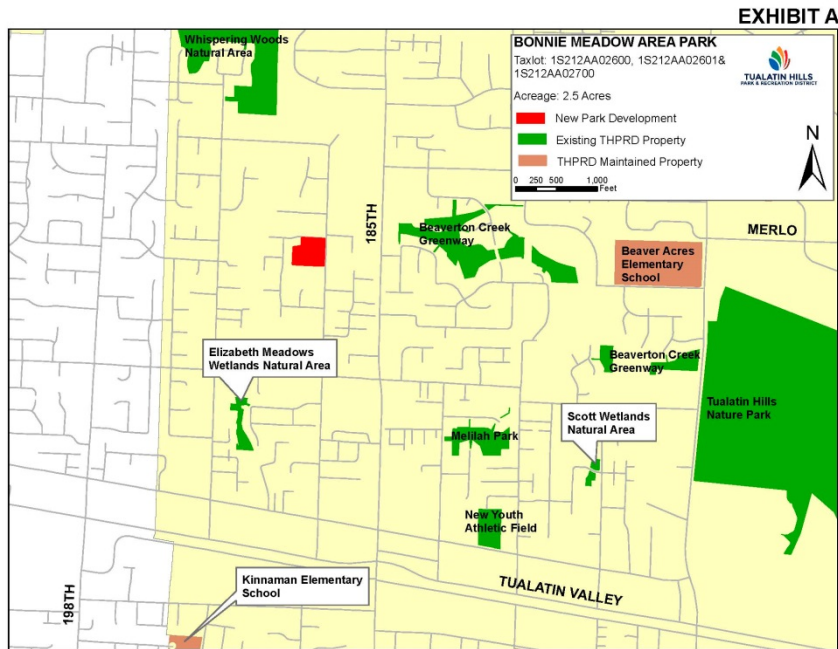
Bonnie Meadow Area Park Open House

About the park site:

This new park will be located within a mixed-density residential neighborhood in the Aloha area of Washington County. The site is composed of three properties located west of SW 187th Avenue and south of SW Bonnie Meadow Lane. The properties form a relatively flat 2.56 acre site that includes a stand of large native oak and ponderosa pine trees and an open grassy area.



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The process:

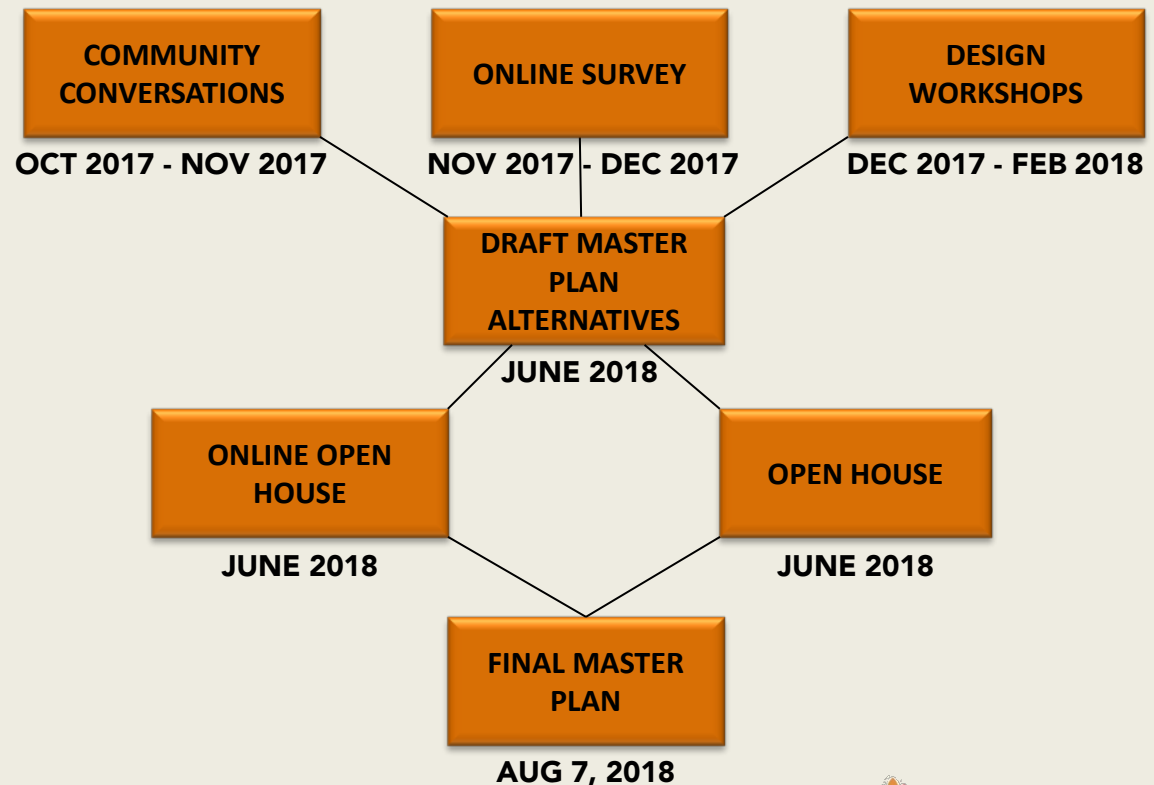
Community involvement is an essential part of the planning and design process. THPRD worked closely with neighbors and the broader community to ensure that the design and proposed use considers the needs of local residents.

Comments and Suggestions:

One shelter near the active area and the other near the community garden

Our goal is to minimize the removal of healthy trees on site

Placed in an area of previous disturbance and within treed area for shade

Placed near 187th for visibility and away from majority of homes

Anticipate sidewalks, parking or bike lane and lighting

Anticipate planted swale
