Park district residents have two ways to register: online <u>www.thprd.org/portal</u> or by phone at 503-439-9400. Online registration runs 24 hours a day, seven days a week and requires an online account. Don't have one? You can set up your online account at <u>www.thprd.org/activities</u> before Dec. 8.

Phone registration runs from 8 am-6 pm on Saturday, Dec. 8 and noon-4 pm on Sunday, Dec. 9.

All registrants need a current THPRD residency card and class information when enrolling. Find out if you're in district at thprd.org/activities/am-i-in-district.

Registration for out-of-district residents begins Monday, Dec. 10 at 8 am.
